THE ENGLISH ORIGINS OF JOHN BRIGGS
OF TAUNTON, MASS.

In 1657 John Briggs, Sr., appeared in Taunton MA where he took the Oath of Fidelity and was granted land next to the house he had purchased from James Burt. In the absence of any record of the purchase of this house from Burt, we cannot say how long (if at all) before 1657 he may have arrived. Briggs has remained somewhat of a mysterious figure, since past research has not found the dates of his birth, marriage, or death. He was alive in 1665, when Shadrach Thayer of Braintree lodged a complaint against him. He was apparently dead by 1675, for in that year a list of "the heads of families in Taunton" includes only his sons William, Richard, and Hugh, together with a Jonathan Briggs (Samuel H. Emery, *History of Taunton MA* [1893] p. 93). He was certainly dead by 1686 when a deed between two of his sons refers to him as then deceased. It appears that John Briggs was an immigrant, not connected with any of the other New England families of that name. For an excellent overview of John Briggs and his descendants, the reader may consult TAG 33:76-83 (Mrs. John E. Barclay, "Notes on the Briggs Families of Taunton, Mass."), and NEHGR 125:77ff. (Edna Anne Hannibal and Claude W. Barlow, "Richard, William and Hugh, Sons of John Briggs of Taunton, Mass.").

Recently, in the course of research into the English origins of my ancestors, Thomas and Richard Thayer of Braintree MA, I stumbled upon the home parish in England of the immigrant John Briggs of Taunton MA. In 1906 Walter Faxon and Edward Henry Whorff presented conclusive evidence that immigrants Thomas and Richard Thayer were originally from the parish of Thornbury, co. Gloucester, England (NEHGR 60:282-91, "Tayer [Thayer] Families in the Parish Register of Thornbury, Gloucestershire, England." Note: Tayer is the original English spelling of the name). After reading this article, I ordered a microfilm copy of the Thornbury parish records to study them further. They proved quite a surprise. Although they were kept in good order starting from 1550, for most of the 100 years following this date the names of the parents were not recorded with the baptism or burial of a child -- only the name of the child and the godparents. As a result, two or three families with the same surname might have had children recorded during the same period, but determining which child belonged to which couple proved extremely challenging.

Making my way through the numerous Tayer-Thayer entries, I finally determined that immigrants Thomas and Richard were the sons of an earlier Richard Thayer who was christened on 6 May 1565 in Thornbury, co. Gloucester, England. I found further that they had at least two brothers and two sisters: Catherine (bp. 24 February 1603); William (bp. 6 May 1605); Agnes (bp. 15 March 1607); and John (bp. 29 April 1610, bur-

ied 12 October 1610). Tracing the subsequent history of Agnes Tayer, I ascertained that she married in Thornbury on 11 May 1633 John Briggs, and they had three children recorded in the Thornbury registers: John Briggs (bp. 1634), Katherine Briggs (bp. 1636/7), and Richard Briggs (bp. 1638/9). The registers indicate that this family was in Thornbury as late as 1644, after which a gap ensues in the parish records. When I checked to learn if this couple might have immigrated to New England, I came upon the John Briggs who first appeared in Taunton MA in 1657.

A review of printed material available on this family convinced me that the John Briggs who married Agnes Tayer at Thornbury in 1633 was indeed the settler of Taunton MA. First, John Briggs the immigrant was known to have had one son, Richard, born prior to 1644. As mentioned above John of Thornbury had a son Richard christened in 1638/9. Second, John Briggs the immigrant almost certainly had a son John of uncertain birth date. We know there must have been a younger John Briggs in Taunton, because the immigrant was called John Briggs, Sr., on several occasions over the period 1657-1664 (lastly on 1 Mar. 1663/4) in the Taunton Proprietors' and Plymouth Colony records; no other known John Briggs seems to fill the need for a younger John living locally at the appropriate time. As seen above, John of Thornbury had a son John baptized in 1634. (NOTE: Hannibal and Barlow [NEHGR 125:77-8] hesitantly proposed John Briggs [Clement] to fill this role, but as Mr. David L. Greene pointed out to me, this John appears to have died before 1662.) Third, in 1645 Shadrach Thayer of Braintree MA lodged a complaint against John Briggs of Taunton MA. Shadrach was a son of Thomas Thayer, the immigrant to Braintree, and therefore would have been a nephew of John Briggs' wife Agnes. Fourth, we know that Nathaniel Thayer, another early settler of Taunton, was son of William and Mary (Kellaway) Tayer of Thornbury; and Nathaniel was also a nephew of John Briggs' wife Agnes. Fifth, among descendants of John Briggs the immigrant, I find that Rebecca Briggs, daughter of his son Richard, married in 1690/1 Nathaniel Thayer, grandson of immigrant Richard Thayer of Braintree. Also I find that Thomas Briggs, son of immigrant John's son William, married in 1689 Abigail Thayer, daughter of Nathaniel Thayer, the immigrant to Taunton.

In summary, all the known facts regarding John Briggs of Thornbury, co. Gloucester, fit the known facts regarding the Taunton MA immigrant. The continued association of the Taunton family with the other Thayer families in New England supplies good supplemental evidence that immigrant John Briggs was indeed the man from Thornbury.

The following items were all the Briggs/Bridges entries found in the Thornbury parish records from 1550 up to 1644 when the gap appears. I also searched for available Briggs/Bridges wills, and located the will of John Briggs' father, Richard Briggs. (Dates shown, including any double dates,

life as given in the records.) Because the Briggs family in Thornbury was not a large one, the skeletal outline of the family was easy to construct.

In the name of god Amen I Richard Briges of Grovesend wth in the p'ishe of Thornbury & Countie of Gloucester husbandman being sickle in Body but of a p'fecte Remembraunce (thankes be unto god) doe make this my last will & Testament in manner & forme ffollowing: ffirste I bequeath my Soule unto almighty god, my maker & to his sonne Ihesus Christ my Redemeer by whose death & passion I trust to be saved & by noe other meane. And my bodye to the earth. It[em] I give & bequeath unto my sonne Willth Briges the son of ten shillinges to be payd unto him wth in three monthe after my deceas. It[em] I give & bequeath unto my sonne John Briges the son of ten shillinges to be payd in like manner. It[em] I give & bequeath to my daughter Joane Draper the son of ten shillinges to be payd wth in three monthe after my deceas. All the rest of my goods cattells & chattellles whatsoever not herin bequeathed (my debts & funerall being discharged) I give and bequeath unto Agnes Briges my wiffe whome I make & ordayne my sole Executrix of this my last will & Testament; In witness whereof I have putt my hand & seal this 30 of Januarie 1619.

A Brief Outline of the Family
 (further accounts in TAG 33:76ff. and NENGR 125:77ff.)

RICHARD^A BRIGGS (or Bridges) b. ca. 1545; buried Thornbury, co. Gloucester, England 30 April 1620. He m. at Thornbury 19 Oct. 1590 AGNES WINGOD, living 30 Jan. 1619(/20). His will indicated he was a husbandman, living at Grovesend, within the parish of Thornbury.

Children (BRIGGS) of Richard and Agnes:

i JOANE m. certainly bef. 30 Jan. 1619(/20) (and prob. bef. 1616)
 ----- DRAPER (perhaps the William Draper who witnessed her father's will); mentioned in father's will of above date.

Their probable (DRAPER) children bp. Thornbury were:

- i RICHARD bp. 17 Nov. 1615.
- ii EDWARD bp. 1 Nov. 1618; prob. bur. Thornbury 6 Jan. 1626(/7).
- iii poss. WILLIAM, who was bp. 25 Feb. 1620(/1) (only if Drap was intended for Draper in the record).

2 JOHN¹ bp. Thornbury 1 May 1595; mentioned in father's 1619 will. He m. Thornbury 17 Nov. 1633 AGNES TAYER, bp. Thornbury 15 March 1607, dau. of Richard Tayer of Thornbury. She was sister of Richard and Thomas Thayer who immigrated to New England in 1640. John and Agnes were living in Thornbury in 1644 (she was godparent to a child of his brother-in-law William Tayer). In or before 1657 John Briggs settled in Taunton MA. He was known to be living in 1665, when his wife's nephew Shadrach Thayer of Braintree MA lodged a legal complaint against him (Shuttleff and Pulsifer, *Rec. of the Colony of New Plymouth in New England*, 12 vols. (Boston 1855-61, rpt. New York 1960), hereafter Plym. Col. Rec., 7:126). He was prob. dead by 1679; no death date has been found for either John or Agnes.

Their (BRIGGS) children, first three bp. Thornbury, were:

- i JOHN² bp. 21 Sept. 1634; prob. the younger John Briggs living in Taunton or nearby in 1661 and 1664, which would account for his father being called John Sr. No other record of him found.
- ii KATHERINE bp. 6 Jan. 1636/7. Nothing further is known of her.
- iii RICHARD bp. 17 March 1638/9; d. Taunton bef. 13 Dec. 1692 (when heirs signed agreement). He m. Taunton 15 Aug. 1662 REBECCA HOSKINS, dau. of William and Ann (Hinds) Hoskins (Plym. Col. Rec. 8:18; NEDRG 125:80).
- iv poss. JOANNA, who m. (presumptive agreement 20 July 1655), as second wife, PETER TALLMAN of Portsmouth RI, Hingham, and Barbados. In the agreement she was called "of Taunton," but no proof found for her relationship to this family (Plymouth Colony LR 3:37; NEDRG 125:80).
- v WILLIAM b. ca. 1645 [not 1649 as in Hannibal, but falls in the gap in Thornbury records]; d. Taunton 3 Jan. 1720 aged 83. He m. (1) Taunton 6 Nov. 1666 SARAH MACOMBER, dau. of William and Ursula (Cooper [see 70 2r 170]) Macomber; she d. Taunton 20 March 1680 (Plym. Col. Rec. 8:35, 81). Did he m. (2) Dedham MA "7th 28th, 1680" (?) ADDAEL MASON (Dedham TR 1:17; NEDRG 125:82, which gives an incorrect date?).
- vi HUGH m. Taunton 1 March 1682/3 MARTHA EVERSON, dau. of John Everson of Plymouth MA (Plym. Col. Rec. 8:84). He d. Taunton bef. 22 Aug. 1692 and 1698 (NEDRG 125:82).

- 3 WILLIAM bp. Thornbury 22 April 1599; living in 1619 (mentioned in father's will). No marriage, death, or children found in Thornbury records.
